Health services need to help them all.

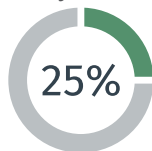


But sometimes people don't know where to get help.


