# 10GM's Cancer & Inequalities project

The Cancer & Inequalities fund is part of 10GM's Cancer & Inequalities project, which is a collaboration between GM Cancer Alliance and other partners from across the wider health and VCSE sector.

The project aims to find innovative ways to tackle health inequalities.

Salford CVS manage the fund on behalf of 10GM.

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# Overview of the fund

Grants of up to £5000 for Greater Manchester-based VCSE organisations to deliver projects that **raise awareness of the early signs and symptoms of cancer, engage communities in conversations around cancers and how to access timely healthcare and identify and understand the barriers people face when receiving a cancer diagnosis.**

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## Priorities of the fund - Specific communities

Your project must engage underserved communities (those at higher risk of a later diagnosis)

- People from lower socio-economic groups
- People with learning disabilities, Autism and Neurodiversity
- People with sensory and/or physical disabilities
- People with mental ill-health and illness
- Racially marginalised communities
- LGBTQ+ community
- Older people
- Men



# Priorities of the fund - Specified cancers

Your project must focus on one or more of the cancers below:

Upper GI (Oesophageal & Stomach cancer)

Lower GI (Bowel cancer)

Urology (bladder, kidney, prostate, testicular)

Lung

Breast

Gynae (Ovarian cancer)

Head & neck cancers



# Priorities of the fund - Linking in with wider health care

Your project must link in with and / or work with the wider health care system including GPs and PCNs.

This could include examples such as:

- Working together to deliver your projects - Gp delivering a session
- Running a session with GPs to feedback barriers you have discovered
- A team member from a GP attending a session



# Difference between rounds 1 and 2

This fund is keen to see groups who applied in round 1 develop their projects with this fund however it isn't essential.

The focus of round 1 was to get conversations about cancer diagnosis and the inequalities started in communities.

Round 2 is looking for projects to continue raising awareness, educating and finding out the barriers people face when it comes to early diagnosis but sharing learning from these activities with the wider health care system.

Round 3 will be about creating practical interventions to address barriers and increase early cancer diagnosis rates.





# What this isn't

Please note this fund will not fund:

Existing activities - make sure your project demonstrates additionality on clearly explains how you will focus and engage communities on cancer.

It is not about increasing cancer screening uptake. It is cancer about early cancer diagnosis.

# Project ideas

Your organisation may already deliver health and engagement activities or you may be a well trusted and respected organisation in your community.

This fund wants groups like these to apply, it is these skills and experiences that will encourage people to share their opinions and feedback on cancer signs and symptoms, early diagnosis, barriers; etc. This on the ground information is what can make a big impact when fed back up to the wider health care system.

Think about how you can gather information, what engages your communities and how you can get this information up to make changes.



# Training, Support & Resources

# Eligibility

## Your group

- Greater Manchester-based Voluntary, Community or Social enterprise organisation (VCSE)
  - Organisations with a max turnover of £250,000
- You must have an organisational bank account with 2 signatories, these cannot be related to one another.
- If you have had previous grants from Salford CVS then you are required to be up to date with previous grant reporting. March 2024

# Grant requirements

If successful:

- Only spend your grant on what you specified in your project.
- Send over copies of specific policies, required for the delivery of your activity e.g. Safeguarding policies.
- Complete an End of project reporting form evaluating your project and collate and share the learning from your project.
- Give permission for your project to feature on 10GM and Greater Manchester Care Alliance website.
- Consider how you will continue to raise awareness of early cancer diagnosis after your project has completed.

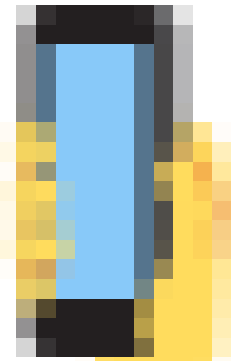
