PROSPECT HOUSE GARDEN GROWS

A remarkable transformation has been seen on the ground to the rear of Prospect House. Pictures speak for themselves but Richard Lewis hard work and that of his colleagues have been recorded and gratefully appreciated.

The early photograph shows the site in 2019 soon after its adoption by Stockport Mencap The line of fir trees had been removed but it was very obvious there was much to be done.

The new boundary of the proposed garden had yet to be marked out requiring removal of a fair of amount of foliage and the old fencing leaving the necessary initial levelling off of the ground.

Throughout the pandemic and the months of lockdown.work has produced the results.



Richard continues:

The work on the accessible garden at the back of **Prospect House** has continued each weekend, despite rain, wind and even sunny dry weather. The basic construction of the raised beds and beautiful flagging is now completed. The guys have worked really hard and the result is superb standards of build for all to see. >>>



We are now ready for the planting of the beds and installation of some works of art including a round mosaic in the flags and some fused glass circles, to be fixed to the wall on the left. The boring fence on the right is transformed into a work of art thanks to our artist in residence and it includes a *trompe l'ceil*, (a mirror to you and me) which makes the garden look larger than it is.

The latest job is the levelling and resurfacing of the rear carpark so everybody can safely use the new garden. We are hoping to finish the planting in time for an official, celebratory opening of the garden in the Spring of next year. with all our friends and sponsors. Fingers crossed!

MENCAP CHAIRMAN'S REPORT TO AGM SEPTEMBER 2022

It seems a long time since I have been able to produce my report to an AGM. I think that it is fair to say that our lives have changed in a number of ways during that time. If anything it has highlighted the problems encountered by parents and carers of people with learning difficulties. In order to help our members our committee has been involved in a number of local groups including CALD, Health Equality Group, Partnership Board and the newly formed DPAG (Direct Payments Action Group).

There have been a number of issues around properties where some of our members are housed and the ever present problems regarding finance and support.

One issue that has loomed large is the suspension of Direct Payments by Stockport. Suffice it to say that due to the combined efforts of independent providers and parents together with the threat of court action this decision has been reversed. The current situation is that Direct Payments can be used as before the Council's new policy. There will now be a 3 month's consultation with parents, carers and providers to produce a more equitable policy based on people's needs.



On a lighter and more pleasing note I would like to thank Richard and his colleagues for the wonderful job they have done in creating a garden space for

our members to enjoy. The value of the space was made obvious at the recent very successful Gateway Barbecue. Congratulations all round!

With regard to the management of Stockport Mencap there has been a change in the Trusteeship. Paul has resigned as a trustee but I am delighted that he has agreed to continue to do the accounts for the Society. I would like, on behalf of the committee and the members. to thank Paul for his diligent work. There is no doubt that our strong financial policy in these difficult times is due in great measure to his work. We are fortunate that Geraldine has agreed to take his place on the Board of Trustees.

We have been working closely with Supportability to put the maintenance and safety of the building on a firmer and more manageable footing. Hopefully these measures will improve things and we will continue to monitor the situation.

It is good to see signs of the return of normality. The ABC and Gateway clubs are reopening. In addition the Halloween disco and Christmas party are organised which I am sure our members will enjoy.

Finally, as always, I would like to thank the committee for all their hard work and support during difficult times. It has enabled us to maintain a first class building for those who use it and a delightful garden to enjoy.
