## **Our upcoming Access to Tech campaign**

We want all people living with diabetes have an equal opportunity to access diabetes technology that could benefit them (Flash, CGM and insulin pumps) in line with national guidelines, regardless of postcode, ethnicity or economic status. In 2022, NICE published new guidelines which recommend extending access to Flash and CGM technologies for people living with diabetes – you can read more <u>here</u>. One year on, we want to make sure these guidelines are met and people living with diabetes can access the diabetes tech they need. We've written to ICBs to find out

more about the policies they have in place and any barriers to implementing the guidelines. From this we will be creating an online visual to show the variation in policies across England and will be using a postcode search tool to enable people to easily find out more about the situation in their area and to take targeted actions depending on local access arrangements. We'll keep you up to date as things progress.
