



## NCFE CACHE Level 3 Diploma in Adult Care

This qualification develops the knowledge and skills needed for working in care settings and is suitable for anyone employed as a senior care assistant, senior healthcare assistant, support worker or key worker in residential settings, community and primary care environments, acute health environments.

It contains both mandatory and optional units allowing learners to tailor the qualification to meet their needs, interests, preferred progression paths and the context of their own job role.

The qualification covers a wide range of areas such as:

- aspects of support
- specialisms
- clinical skills or healthcare tasks
- leadership and management skills

This qualification aims to:

- ★ offer breadth and depth of study, incorporating a key core of knowledge
- ★ provide opportunities to acquire several practical and technical skills

<b>Unit M6:</b>	Promote health and safety in care settings
<b>Unit M6B:</b>	Support the health and wellbeing of individuals in a care setting
<b>Unit M7:</b>	Scope and responsibilities of an adult care worker
<b>Unit M8:</b>	Understand duty of care
<b>Unit M9:</b>	Understand how to safeguard individuals
<b>Unit M10:</b>	Understand mental capacity and restrictive practices
<b>Unit M11:</b>	Infection prevention and control in a care settings

*Specialisation units will be included in the learner's Individual Learning Plan based on the learner's specific to the work environment (dementia, mental health, etc.)*

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Delivery:

This is a work based qualification, aimed to be completed within 6 to 9 months via the below methods:

- ★ One to One Sessions with your assessor
- ★ Observations in the workplace
- ★ Independent study and research
- ★ Paper-based and/or digital resources
