**CO-BENELDOPA (INCLUDING MADOPAR.** Important changes about (special container) status. You might be already aware of these changes, but I felt it was important to share.

From 1 February 2023 all Co-beneldopa products, including Madopar, have been provided in pack sizes of 100 only.

This change means that people with Parkinson's should speak to the person who prescribes their medicines, usually their GP, to ensure their prescription for Co-beneldopa or Madopar tablets and capsules, of all strengths, is adequate.

When the quantity prescribed falls exactly between 2 containers, pharmacists have been told to round down, and supply the nearest complete container. When the quantity ordered is more than halfway into the second pack size, the second complete container should also be supplied.

This could mean that a person with Parkinson's might need to access their next repeat prescription either a few days earlier or later than they usually would have done.

For example, a person who receives a decrease in supply, compared to the usually prescribed quantity, may need to access their next repeat prescription a few days earlier. However, a person who receives an increase in supply compared to a prescribed quantity may need to access their next repeat prescription a few days later.

#### What you should do

If you take Co-beneldopa or Madopar, this change could mean you get more or less than you're used to.

If this is the case, speak to your prescriber to ensure you have enough medication and that this change is reflected on your records.

Pharmacists and their teams should explain what these changes mean to each person affected.

#### **GOING INTO HOSPITAL?**

Below is an extract from NICE (National Institute for Health and Care Excellence) Quality standard (QS164) Published: 09 February 2018 regarding the administration of Levodopa to persons with Parkinson's disease whilst in hospital or a care home. Quality statement

Adults with Parkinson's disease who are in hospital or a care home take levodopa within 30 minutes of their individually prescribed administration time.

#### Rationale

Serious complications can develop if levodopa is not taken on time. These include acute akinesia and, if delays are significant, neuroleptic malignant syndrome. These complications can lead to increased care needs and increased length of stay in hospital or a care home. What the guality statement means for different audiences

Service providers (hospitals and care homes) ensure that adults with Parkinson's disease are identified on admission so that their requirements for levodopa can be accurately identified and monitored to reflect timings before admission. This should include an assessment of self-medication. Providers should ensure that staff are trained to understand the importance of taking levodopa at the appropriate times, and to report any medicines-related patient safety incidents.

**Health and social care practitioners** (such as doctors, nurses, pharmacists, and care home managers and staff) ensure that adults with Parkinson's disease have an accurate medicines chart that reflects timings for levodopa before admission. Practitioners should support adults with Parkinson's disease to take levodopa on time, which may include self-medication. Practitioners should report any medicines-related patient safety incidents for adults with Parkinson's disease.

Adults with Parkinson's disease who are admitted to hospital or a care home know that they need to take their levodopa medicine on time and are supported to do so. This will ensure that they do not develop complications that can happen when this medicine is not taken at the right time.

NEW LAB TEST COULD HELP IMPROVE EARLIER DIAGNOSIS OF PARKINSON'S

Those of you who visit the Parkinson.org website might have already seen this exciting news. Again, I felt it important enough to share.

Latest study results show a new test could help diagnose Parkinson's before cell damage occurs.

At the moment, there's no definitive test to confirm a Parkinson's diagnosis. This means that currently, it's estimated that 26% of people with Parkinson's are misdiagnosed at first. A simple diagnostic test for Parkinson's would help people have a smoother diagnosis, allowing them to get information, support and access to treatments and therapies more quickly.

#### What does the new test do?

The lab test involves taking a sample of cerebrospinal fluid (CSF), a clear liquid that surrounds the brain and spinal cord, via an injection into the spine called a lumbar puncture.

The research team then uses this to look for a protein called alpha-synuclein. In Parkinson's, clumps of a misfolded form of the alpha-synuclein protein can be found. This toxic form of the protein can damage dopamine-producing cells and may be responsible for the development and spread of the condition in the brain.
