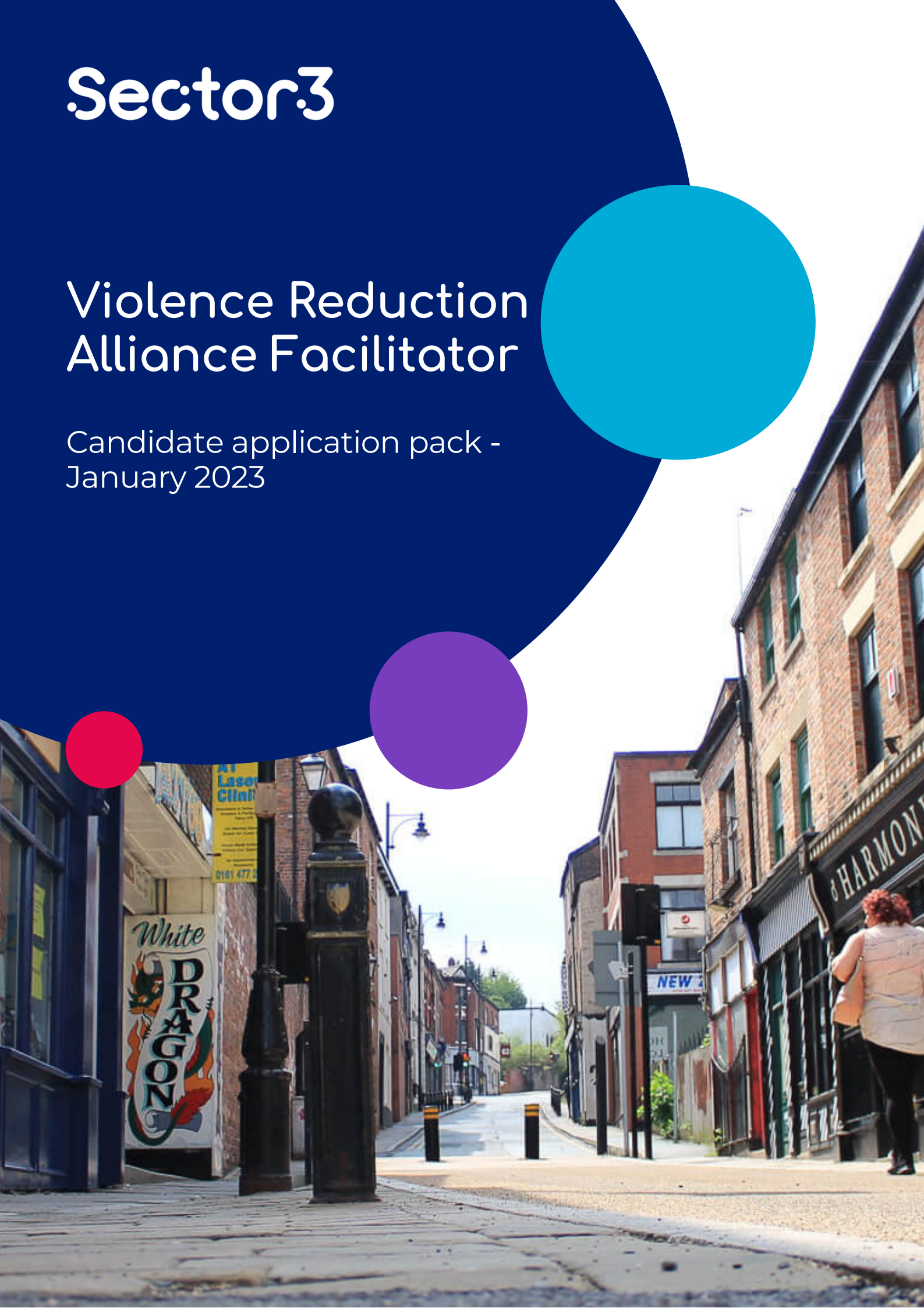

About this role

Closing Date: 29 January

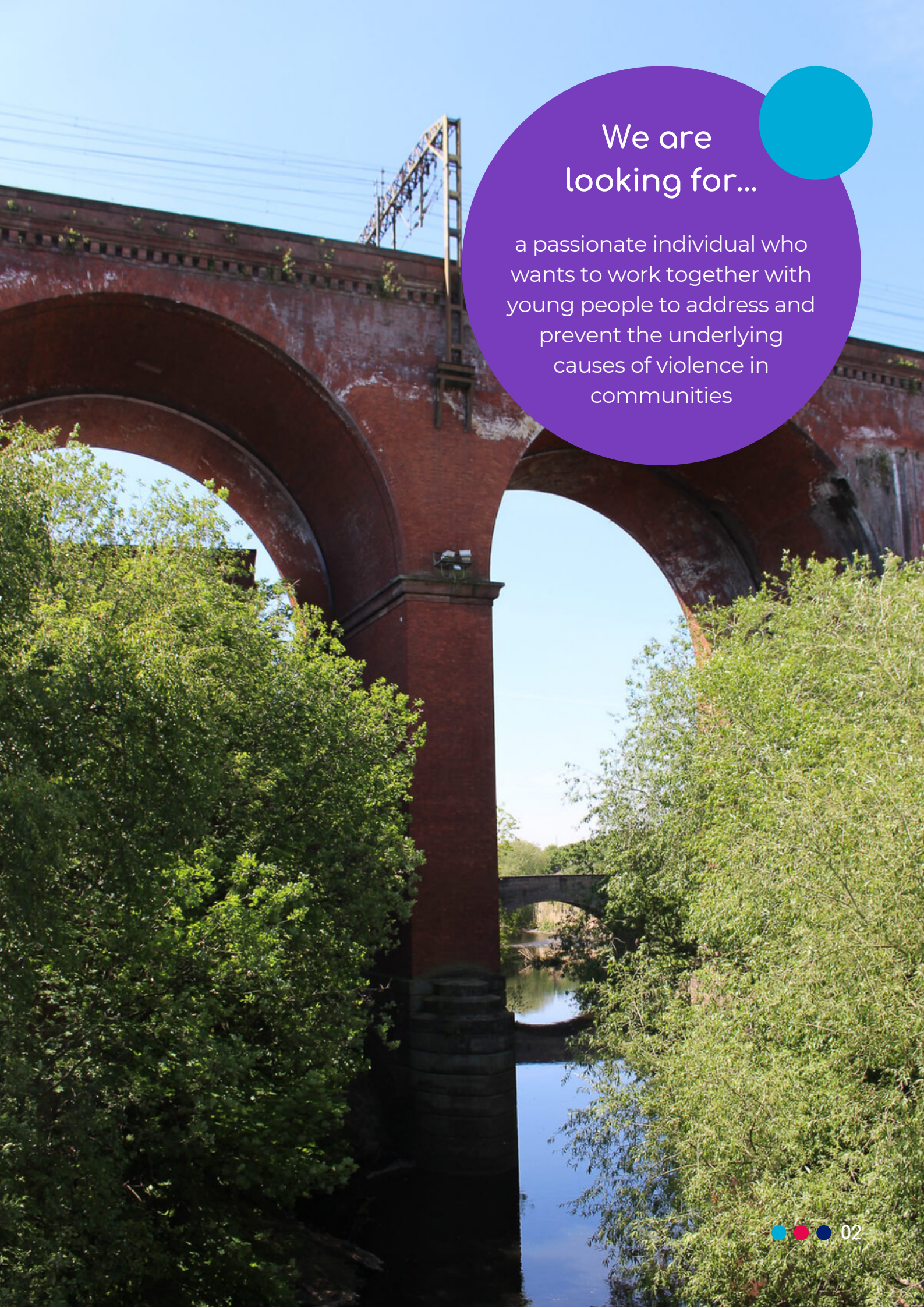

We support individuals, organisations and communities through a multi-faceted suite of support, training, guidance and funding opportunities, enabling organisations to deliver social action on local priorities

The Violence Reduction Alliance Facilitator role is part of a new initiative across Greater Manchester. The key focus of the role is to work with young people and the wider community to look at the core causes of violence within identified areas. This is specifically exploring the cause and potential solutions to reducing violence with young people aged between 10 and 25 years.

As part of the role, you will consult with young people, co-designing activities and agreeing priorities. With funding to kick start the initial year 1 phase of the programme, you will work with local community groups, organisations and other providers to create long standing partnerships to engage young people. This will involve stakeholder engagement, community development, partnership management and grant support.

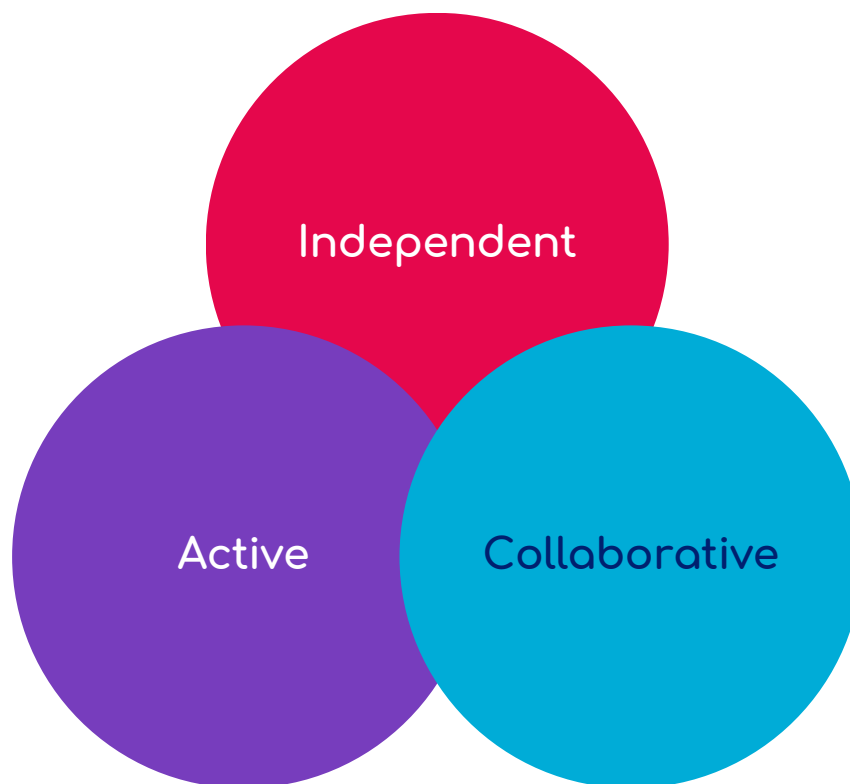

Main things you will be asked in your role

- Engage with young people and communities to understand the strengths and challenges in a particular area
- Provide engaging opportunities to consult with young people aged between 10 – 25 to understand their personal challenges and vulnerabilities
- Make sure that the voices of young people and communities are heard throughout the Violence Reduction Programme
- Co-design activities and priorities with young people, based on their ideas and insights
- Understand the local area – mapping the physical assets and to get to know who lives and works there
- Work alongside existing networks and forums such as the Safer Stockport Partnership to engage other services in working together to reduce violence in the identified communities
- Support the activity of a local funding panel
- Lead on a partnership approach with local services to plan joint initiatives, supporting with funding applications, advising on collecting evidence of outcomes and support with producing evaluation reports
- Support the creation of a local violence reduction action plan or similar document(s)
- Create and strengthen communication and the relationships between Alliance members
- Collate relevant community information to inform strategic decision making
- Ensure that learning from the programme is shared with partners to develop stronger cross-sector and cross-borough relationships and developments
- Support regular networking, learning, feedback and engagement events.
- Arrange, coordinate and provide training to partners.
- Work with other local Violence Reduction Alliance Facilitators as a team to share resources and learning
- Produce regular update reports
